This visual story is designed for visitors to Ailie Cohen Puppet Maker's delightful production *of The Secret Life of Suitcases.* Presented at Arts Centre Melbourne and originally co-produced by the Unicorn Theatre, this production is a collaboration with Playwright and Director Lewis Hetherington.

Arts Centre Melbourne is committed to providing performances that allow everyone to experience the wonder of theatre. The relaxed performance on August 12 is especially designed to welcome children with disability or sensory sensitivities, their families and adults.

The atmosphere is 'relaxed', with lights kept on during the performance and a quiet space in the foyer if you need to take a break. Noisy enthusiasm is embraced and moving around during the performance is okay!


There are no strobe lighting or theatre smoke effects in this production. There are some gentle lighting changes in the middle of the performance, and one of the suitcases contains small flashing lights for a few minutes. Personal headphones may be useful.

Photography and mobile devices are not permitted during the performance, however if you need to use a device (i.e. iPad) to assist with communication, please inform the ushers.

The staff will tell us when we can go inside and sit down, and get ready! It's important to listen to the staff.




First we will meet **Ailie** and **Sam**. They perform with puppets. **A Quark** is a very furry puppet!
