Where is the Education season of *Where is the Green Sheep?* being performed?

The Education season of *Where is the Green?* is being presented at the **National Theatre, St Kilda** not at Arts Centre Melbourne. The following week it will be presented at Arts Centre Melbourne as a part of our Families and Children program.

The National Theatre is located at 20 Carlisle St (corner of Carlisle and Barkly St), St Kilda 3182.

Why is it at a different venue?

Due to ongoing construction as part of [Reimagining Arts Centre Melbourne](#) to better our facilities for years to come, Arts Centre Melbourne has partnered with other organisations to maximise the ability to provide matinee opportunities for schools. Due to venue availability and construction impacts in 2026, partnering with The National Theatre provides the best opportunity for students around Victoria to experience this work.

What if we can't afford to travel?

For schools that are a part of our [First Call Fund Subsidy program](#), we will have a bus reimbursement to assist in travel support. Please note that due to high demand this reimbursement is limited, and we encourage public transport where possible.

About the Show

What is *Where is the Green Sheep?*

Where is the Green Sheep? Is an immersive visual theatre experience based on the beloved children's book by Mem Fox and Judy Horacek. Written for the stage and directed by Eva Di Cesare, this Monkey Baa Theatre production blends puppetry and animation to create an imaginative and fun journey.

Who is this for?

Kindergarten - Year 2 (Ages 3-6).

What sort of show is it? What is it about?

Where is the Green Sheep? Follows three farmers on their quest to find that elusive

Green sheep. Along the way, we meet Blue Sheep who loves blue flowers, Red Sheep who loves to cartwheel in the fields, Bath Sheep who loves bubbles, and Bed Sheep who loves to bounce... But where IS that Green Sheep?

This production invites young audiences to join the search through an immersive theatrical experience. Co-created with students from Bankstown West Public School, the production integrates their voices as narrators and engages students and young people in joyful problem solving and curious discovery.

Where is the Green Sheep? runs for 45 minutes with no interval.

Venue Information

[Where can we park?](#)

There is varied street and commercial parking available around The National. Please view the [National Theatre webpage](#) to view the detailed parking map.

The closest multi-story paid parking is located at Acland Court Village. This is for vehicles that do not exceed 2.00m in height.

Where can our bus drop us off?

For performance days, we have organised a section of Barkley Street opposite The National Theatre and J Talbot reserve Playground as a Bus Drop off zone. More information regarding bus drop off and pick up will be provided in our preshow emails.

What are the closest public transport options?

The National Theatre is easily accessible by public transport. Tram routes 16 and 3a stop directly in front of the Theatre at stop 33, while the No. 96 tram stops at Luna Park, just a 350-metre walk away. If traveling by train, Balaclava Station is approximately a 15-minute walk (1200 metres) from the Theatre.

Will there be pram or wagon parking?

Prams and wagons may be parked in the entrance foyer, and staff will assist in parking placement.

We recommend teachers and/or parent support bring their essential items with them into the theatre and leave their prams and wagons in the entrance foyer.

Can we bring our school bags into the performance?

We ask that school bags are left on the bus if possible or they can be stored in the foyer of the National theatre.

How accessible is the venue?

The entrance to the main auditorium is up two levels. There is a staff-operated lift to the first level and then a stair climber for wheelchair users and those who require no or limited steps to the next level. We ask that you advise us of your accessibility needs in advance and please make yourself known to staff if you or someone, you're attending with require its usage.

Please note that our stair climber has a weight limit of 200 kgs so may not be suitable for large, motorized wheelchairs or scooters.

There is room within the theatre for wheelchair users to either transfer into theatre seats or remain in their wheelchair. Patrons remaining in their wheelchair or mobility aide may be positioned in a wide central aisle in the theatre and a free-standing chair is available to place a companion beside them.

If you need to step out of the performance at any point, ushers will be available to assist you in exiting and re-entering the performance.
